Digital Displays Coming to Athletics

The menu boards at your favorite fast food place, the check-in queue when you visit the doctor, and the advertisement signs throughout the grocery store are all examples of visual communication. Visual communication is about to make a strong appearance in Penn State Athletics with the help of Four Winds Interactive. Four Winds Interactive is a Denver based company that can claim 90% of the digital signs on the Las Vegas strip, every sign in the Amway Center - home of the Orlando Magic - and recently helped Colorado State University with a revamp in their athletic facilities.

We have recently chosen Four Winds Interactive as our digital signage software provider. Four Winds and Penn State have been long time partners as they service the digital signage solutions in the HUB, Libraries and other buildings across campus. Penn State Athletics is using the software for a number of slated projects such as a revamp on the All-Sports Museum, video end caps in the Lasch Locker Room, concessions boards in Rec Hall, Multi-Sport and Beard Field.

The Four Winds software has been created to be as simple to use as possible. Essentially, there are two halves to the software – one half creates and manages the sign information while the other half is physically connected to the display screens to play it. The creation software uses templates and regions to display 19 different forms of contents, including video, images, HTML, live data, and live TV. The player can be a small computer mounted to the back of the display or it can be a computer housed in a nearby location such as an AV closet. Four Winds supports touchscreens as well so content can be much more rich and inviting.



Sign building has never been easier. Four Winds provides an App Store that provides a variety of free content, templates and different apps to make your signs easier and faster to build. They are constantly adding content to the store and welcome suggestions.

Four Winds also includes a variety of reporting data such as interactivity reports which that track touch interactivity. You can analyze the sign for relevance or eye-catching content. The software also allows you to schedule your content to maximize impact. For example, you could have a game mode for venue signs where they display all game-related content before, during and immediately after the game but switch back to general information afterwards. With prior planning, the signs can have immeasurable impact.

Athletics IT encourages everyone to stop by our office to take a look at our demo interactive sign and our triple-screen message board. Rand and Steph recently visited the Four Winds headquarters in Denver for a conference for some hands-on interaction with the system. As you can imagine, a digital signage software company has many signs throughout their offices. Some signs project sales quotas and HR info; others show the local traffic; some incorporate social media platforms; all of them switch to pictures of employees and their pets for 5 minutes at the end of every hour. Visual communication is a way to engage our fans, inform our co-workers and incorporate fun into the work place and our venues.

2017 Adobe Software Licensing Changes

In the next few months, Adobe software licensing will be changing within Athletics and Penn State as a whole. All current Adobe Creative Cloud users will be receiving emails to create accounts with Adobe that will be linked with their employment to Intercollegiate Athletics. With that account, they will be able to use pre-loaded Creative Cloud Software to install all currently available Adobe products without the need to contact an I.T. administrator.

You can use the PSU sponsored account on 2 machines, one of which must be PSU Owned. That means this account will also allow you to install Adobe software for Work at Home on a personal machine! Yay! Please feel free to ask any questions about the changes.

Non-full time and student machines will continue to use their old style licensing.

PCI Systems

Within Athletics, we have specific computer systems that require a substantially more scrutinized security profile to protect the data on those machines. Examples include:

Archtics - TicketMaster's ticket sales PCs

MaxGalaxy - Pegula Ice Rink PCs

GolfNow - Penn State Golf Courses PCs

Penn State's Office of Information Security requires quarterly security scans to ensure that these machines are closed to outside access and aren't running vulnerable software. These scans run independently and require no interaction by employees. Athletics IT is responsible for enforcing these scans and remedying any vulnerabilities found.

In doing so, customer information such as credit card numbers, addresses, phone numbers, and other personally identifiable information is kept more secure from the prying eyes of the internet.

You may have noticed the ability to issue shutdowns on these machines has been limited. When PCI machines are offline, they cannot receive their security updates and are flagged as vulnerable when restarted. In order to stay ahead of potential vulnerabilities, Athletics IT requires that PCI machines remain powered on at all times.

Rec Hall Replay System Installed

Over the summer of 2016, a new replay system was installed for use for sports played in the Rec Hall main gym. Designed with Volleyball in mind, four cameras have been installed to watch both side and end lines. As well as an additional camera situated to view the top of the net. Utilizing the DVSports hardware similar to Football and Basketball, Penn State Volleyball continues to provide the best possible competitive atmosphere.

The four ceiling mounted cameras are full PTZ (Pan-Tilt-Zoom) HD cameras delivering a crisp detailed picture for where they are set. They can be controlled remotely and separately to provide video of anywhere needed within the gym. The net camera is same kind used by the NFL inside pylons in the end zone.

For Volleyball's challenge system, Head coaches are allowed three challenges per match. Once a challenge is lodged, the number of permitted challenges is reduced by one, regardless of the outcome of the challenge. This has no effect on the number of allowed timeouts, and only one challenge can be used per rally. Coaches can challenge:

- A ball ruled in or out (including pancakes and antennas).
- A ball contacting a player (including four hits).
- Net faults by a player.
- Service foot faults.

Phishing & You How to Protect Yourself Against Identity Theft

You've heard the term. But do you really know what it means? According to Merriam-Webster, phishing is defined as, "a scam by which an e-mail user is duped into revealing personal or confidential information which the scammer can use illicitly."

Both Penn State and Athletics use sophisticated filters on our email servers designed to filter out unwanted emails. Unfortunately, this cat and mouse game can be a difficult one. Occasionally, messages sneak through our software asking for personal information such as credit card information, social security numbers, or passwords. These emails are known as "phishing lures".

We have seen an uptick in the last few years of incoming emails attempting to phish information from Penn State employees. These are something so well crafted that we, in Athletics IT, have trouble scrutinizing their sincerity. Here are a few key things to look for when attempting to determine the legitimacy of an email asking for personal information:

- **Spelling and/or grammatical errors** Official emails from large entities like Google, Yahoo, or Amazon will not contain spelling errors. This is a sure sign that the email is probably fake.
- Links to foreign countries or odd websites If an email from a company comes from a country you've never heard of, it's probably fake.
- **Emails without specifics** If the signature on an email from a help desk signs it "the Help Desk", be suspicious.
- Penn State's policies Penn State will never ask for your password or username through email. Your email will never expire and it will never run out of space in Athletics. Emails asking for any of these are definitely fake.

As you can see, the above email violates nearly every rule in the list. Not only does the example come from "The Office of IT Infrastructure", which isn't a real Penn State department, but the link points to a website online which does not belong to Penn State. By hovering over the links but not clicking on them, you can determine where they lead without any risk. The email also contains inadequate grammatical checking. Most importantly, Penn State will never ask you to upgrade your storage or to validate your email.

You Can Print to Any Athletics Printer

On a Windows PC, you can view and browse all of the printers in Athletics and print to them directly from your machine. Simply press Start, then type in "\printers" (without the quotes) and double-click the printer to install it. Voila.

Not All Fonts are Free

If you need that special font for your next project, be prepared that not all fonts are free for use. Some developers require a payment if used for non-personal use. The grey area between personal use and commercial use in Intercollegiate Athletics is pretty large. We will do everything we can to legally obtain and install fonts for your use.
